

Back by popular demand Caramel Corn

Oven temperature 250 degrees. Put corn in large roaster & put in oven while preparing sauce.

2 - 7 oz bags of corn puffs
2 cups brown sugar
½ # margarine/butter
½ cup light Karo syrup

Boil brown sugar, butter, Karo for 5 minutes in a large saucepan, stirring frequently. Remove from heat & add:

1 tsp vanilla + 1 tsp salt + 1 tsp baking soda
Stir well. Mixture will become foamy.

Pour over corn & mix well. Place in oven for 45 minutes, stirring every 15 minutes, mixing well, from bottom of pan. After 45 minutes, spread on wax paper to cool.

^{***} butter corn puffs will work. Don't buy cheese flavor. At this time of year, Aldi sells them for the best price (8 oz bags)

^{***} use a large roaster to make mixing easier. Do not try to do this on a cookie sheet.






