Welcome to Fall! . . . and so much to be thankful for!!!

I was trying to clean up my sewing space, putting things away & straightening up & was thinking about how many of some things I have. Anyone who has visited my studio I quite aware that I have an affinity for pin cushions, buttons, sewing décor & scissors! Holy cow at the numbers. Now granted it is a collection that spans a lot of years – I have some from my mom, a pair of pinking shears that I used when I still lived at home; a pair of monogramed scissors from my clothing services teacher from high school & lots of scissors of all shapes, colors, sizes & uses.

I particularly love vintage reproductions & any "pretty" scissors. Some purchased & some



This started me thinking about the history of scissors & how far back they go back in history. I can't even imagine being without a rotary cutter, much less scissors & all the different use / types.

It was first thought that Leonardo Da Vinci invented scissors, but it was actually the Mesopotamians. The oldest form of scissors dates back to nearly 4,000 years ago, found in the middle east made with bronze. They were spring style, with 2 blades joined by a softer more flexible metal on the back end of the 2 blades which were squeezed together for use. Much like many snips are made today!!



Around 1500 BC ancient Egyptian scissors in similar style, (picture right) but were very large, heavy & clearly for outdoor use. Ancient romans are believed to be the first to enhance scissors with the pivot style. Roman scissors have been found dating to 100AD with the pivot style. Eastern civilizations such as Japan & China may have introduced a version of the central pivot that we see today.



Scissors began to be produced on small scale in Hangzhou China in 1663, large scale mass-produced scissors didn't occur until the 1700's in the western hemisphere, starting with Robert Hinchcliffe in England in 1761 made of fine cast steel that we still see today.

In the hands of skilled craftsmen some scissors took the shapes of delicate birds or etched with beautiful designs. Our stork embroidery scissors come to mind here. I saw one post that indicated midwives had specially made stork scissors to cut umbilical cords on newborn babies.

I finally purchased some Kai scissors & thought I had found that I would never own anything else. Later my friend gifted some Guggenhein scissors that cut like "buttah"

So, tell me how many scissors do you admit to owning? How many styles? What is your favorite brand?


Meeting in Person @ Congregational United Church of Christ And on Zoom
