May 2025 GCQG Presidents Message



Mothers come in many shapes and sizes. They also come with many different faces. Mothers may be classified as those who gave birth or who adopted children they love as their own. It's hard to say what a mother really looks like. Most of us are mothers because of our caregiving and encouragement. Those are the criteria that I personally believe make us mothers.

My paternal grandmother showered my sister and me with love and gentle lessons when our father

failed to understand what we needed. Her role as mother continued long into what would be considered her retirement. Though my grandmother did quilt, I don't think she ever created a Grandmother's Flower Garden (GFG) quilt. That special hexagonal quilt originated in England as an early form of English Paper Piecing (EPP). EPP was recorded as early as 1770. GFG migrated to America during the 1830s, with its first published pattern in the Godey's Ladies Book in1835 under the name Mosaic. For its use of scraps, size as you needed flexibility and varied colors, it became especially popular in America during The Great Depression of the 1920s and 1930s. Phoeba Johnson (1883-1984) taught her daughter Emma Russell to make a famous version of the GFG which is among the Smithsonian's treasured quilts. Their family became instrumental in documenting African American quilting in our country, illustrating how so many learned from their mothers and their mothers before them.

I suppose we never really stop being mothers, to our children and to the world. Remember those you consider mothers in your life in your own special way. Perhaps a home cooked meal or card would brighten her/their day. If your mother(s) is no longer with us, I'm sending you a hug and hoping your memories bring you joy. Michelle





This group is focused on non-traditional quilting and styles such as art quilts,

various types of fabric, digitized images and three-dimensional techniques. This particular show will include the works of Beecasso artists Pat Arndt, Vickie Clontz, Ellen Hart, Kathy Johnson, Nancy Lassister, Gail McNeill, Valerie Paterson, Joan Rutledge, Penny Sharp, Jenny Williams, Mary Jo Wimberly, Nanette S.
